# School Photographs ....

Cool for School photography will take pupil photographs on Monday 11th October.

This year only individual photographs will be taken. Family groups within the school will not be permitted and older and younger siblings cannot come in for photographs.

Children will be kept in their class bubbles whilst the photographs are taken and all equipment will be sanatised between classes.

Pupils will be given an online code on the day so that parents can log into the website and view their child's photographs and decide what to order. The school will not be handling any orders this year.

#### Homework

Homework has now begun again! Homework is an essential part of your child's learning and we would like to thank parents for their continued support in this area. We know it isn't easy! It is essential that children are reading every day and that learning homework is completed thoroughly. Rather than simply asking your child to spell words back to you, allow them to write them down as this is how they are asked them in class. Multiplication tables are also essential as they help children answer questions more speedily when they engage in more challenging mathematics in years 4 - 7.

#### Administration of medication in school

If a child must take medication in school their parent or guardian MUST complete a school Administration of Medication Form on the School App. There have been a few issues with this but the new forms should be available from next week.

Please remember, if your child requires an inhaler (or any other type of medication) it is your responsibility to ensure there is an adequate supply in school and that it is in date. Please remember, school staff can only administer medication in accordance to prescribed instructions or instructions from a GP or Care Plan.

Unfortunately, the disruption of COVID is very much around us and I know how challenging that is for parents. A copy of the PHA flowchart is on our website but as the guidance has changed so many times it can be very confusing. Please contact us by telephone or email if you are unsure of what to do.

- If your child is required to get a PCR test at any point during the term, I would ask that the result (negative or positive) is emailed to the school as soon as possible. Your co-operation with this means we can get the child / children back into school as soon as possible.
- Please note, that if parents do not gain a negative PCR test result for their child on day 2 of being a
  close contact, the pupil will have to isolate for 10 days. Principals have no discretion on this as it is
  Public Health guidance and must be followed. A second test is required on Day 8 and again results
  should be shared with the school.

I am very appreciative that the majority of parents continue to wear masks at pick-up time. I know it isn't popular so thank you!

#### After -School Clubs

All children in P1-7 received notes about after-school activities beginning again in the first week in October. Please return the forms to school as soon as possible as places are limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Unfortunately, we are still unable to offer a full range of clubs because of covid restrictions still in place.
