## PRIMARY 7 TRANSFER ARRANGEMENTS

Primary 7 parents and pupils will be notified on Saturday 21st May of the outcome of the Post Primary application procedure. An email from the Education Authority will be issued to parents on the morning of Saturday 21st May, therefore parents do not need to login to the online portal to see where their child has been offered a place.

Depending on the outcome of the application procedure, parents will receive one of three emails:

1. Child is selected by the school of first preference;
2. Child is selected by a school which is not the first preference;
3. Child is not yet placed in a school.

Signposting within each email will guide parents to sources of support if needed. Please note, most Post Primary Schools do not require confirmation of acceptance of a school place. If any post primary schools require this, they will contact you directly with instructions on how to respond.

Parents will be advised that the offer of a school place may be subject to providing verifying information, again if this is the case, the post primary school will contact you with guidance. Hopefully all our P7 pupils have been placed in a school of their choice. If this is not the case and you want advice moving forward, the Education Authority will have an Admissions Helpdesk operating from 9am to 12 noon on Saturday 21st May. We wish all our P7 pupils and families all the best with their application outcomes.
